Godliness: Greek word is eusebeia (yoo-seb'-i-ah)

- Piety towards God. Or, a reverence and love for God is.

John 3:16-17 (ESV)

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. 17) For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Contentment: Greek word is autarkeia (ow-tar-ki'-ah)

-A perfect condition of life in which no aid or support is needed.-Satisfaction or sufficiency

PURSUE GODLINESS

- 1. PRAY for more faith
 - "I believe; help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24)
- 2. MEDITATE on God's promises
 - "I will meditate on your precepts and fix my eyes on your ways (Psalms 119:15)
- 3. PEER MANAGEMENT
 - "Encourage one another and build one another up" (1 Thess 5:11)
- 4. LIVE SACRIFICIALLY
 - "Do not be haughty but associate with the lowly" (Rom 12:16)

What is Biblical Contentment?

God provided trust and satisfaction in the person and work of Jesus Christ

- A perfect condition of life in which no aid or support is needed
 - Rest or quietness of mind in the present condition
